BUD POTTER

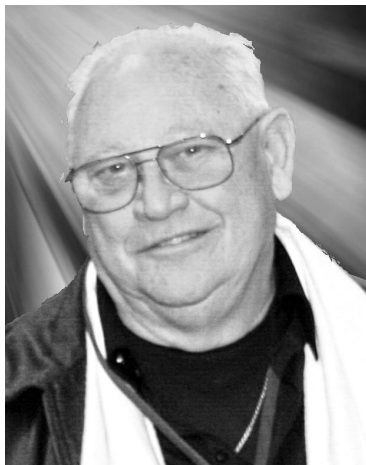
